



The absolute highlights for your Swiss rail journey. There's no other country that does stunning scenery quite like Switzerland, and it's all accessible by train.

1 Bernina Express: from Chur to Tirano or Lugano
This premium panoramic train connects the north of Europe to its south – right through the heart of the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Rhaetian Railway. As it masters every ascent, the fire-red train offers unrivalled views of mountains, glaciers and palm trees.

2 Glacier 3000, 2,971 m a.s.l.
This excursion mountain in the west of Switzerland captivates with an impressive panorama and the Peak Walk by Tissot. This is a 107-metre suspension bridge connecting two peaks. At a lofty altitude of 3,000 metres.

3 Glacier Express: from St. Moritz to Zermatt
Enjoy the most diverse views since the introduction of panoramic trains. From St Moritz through the Rhine Gorge over the Oberalp Pass to Europe's most famous mountain, the Matterhorn in Zermatt. All on the slowest express train in the world.

4 GoldenPass Panoramic: from Montreux to Zweisimmen
Lake Geneva, vineyards, and impressive castles: the GoldenPass Panoramic combines the French-speaking "Riviera" region around Montreux with characteristic Swiss hillscapes. Step on the train and let the picturesque landscapes roll by.

5 Gotthard Panorama Express: from Lugano to Lucerne
The Gotthard Panorama Express is more than just a panoramic route: here, train and boat merge two beautiful Swiss regions into one unique experience. Starting in the Ticino, the journey leads first over the Gotthard mountain route and then across Lake Lucerne to the city of Lucerne.

6 Gornergrat, 3,089 m a.s.l.
Clearly, this mountain is among the Swiss highlights. The cog railway takes you directly from Zermatt station to lofty heights. The journey alone already provides you with countless postcard motifs.

7 Luzern-Interlaken Express: from Lucerne to Interlaken
Boarding in Central Switzerland, leaning back and arriving in the Jungfrau Region less than two hours later. The journey on the Luzern-Interlaken Express leads along turquoise lakes and numerous waterfalls.

8 Jungfraujoch, 3,454 m a.s.l.
Top of Europe – high Alpine fascination made from ice and snow. An excursion destination with constant magical powers and an almost infinite view on clear days. From Interlaken in just one and a half hours to the summit.

9 Rigi, 1,797 m a.s.l.
The "Queen of the mountains", easily accessible by train, bus and boat: no fewer than nine mountain railways lead up the enormous rock massif and provide access to 120 kilometres of hiking trails. The ride up Mount Rigi is included in the Swiss Travel Pass.

10 Boat cruise on Lake Lucerne
Where tradition meets the modern age. Whether by historic steamer, innovative yacht or state-of-the-art catamaran: you always glide across the waters of Lake Lucerne in style. And as a holder of a Swiss Travel Pass even without any surcharge.

11 Schilthorn, 2,970 m a.s.l.
Piz Gloria – panoramic view in all its glory and the world's first revolving restaurant: on the Schilthorn summit, the beauty of the high Alpine scenery unfolds in its entirety and spectacularly stages the UNESCO World Heritage Site with Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau.

12 Tittlis, 3,020 m a.s.l.
Apart from its impressive relief, the only accessible glacier in Central Switzerland also offers Europe's highest suspension rope bridge. The ride on the revolving cableway Tittlis Rotair is an exciting experience in itself.

13 Stoos railways
The Stoos railways connect to the car-free mountain village Stoos – while setting a world record. The funicular railway from Schwyz to Stoos is the steepest in the world. A technical wonder, which makes the trip a one-of-a-kind experience.
